



A Guide to Class 3

Staffing

Mrs Stephenson is the Class teacher with Miss Dell as full time Teaching assistant. There will also be other adults working in Class 3 at other times.

Curriculum

Everything your child will learn in Class 3 can be found under the Class page of the website. The knowledge organisers explain what the children will be learning and the key vocabulary they will cover in each subject. The curriculum has been carefully mapped to ensure coverage for children who are in both Year 3 and Year 4. Please do ask if you need further information about what children are learning when.

Reading

Your child must have both their home/school link book and their reading book in school every day. They will need to remember to ask to change their reading book if they need to. They should be reading at home, on average 4 times a week. Please record this on the 'Boom reader' app, the details of which will be supplied in September. Parents can help develop their child's reading/comprehension by asking them questions about what they have read and by modelling good reading, including the use of expression.

Library Books

Your child has the opportunity to visit the library on a Friday. This is their chance to change their library book if they wish.

Homework

Children should read at least 4 times a week and this needs to be recorded on the Boomreader App. They should also practise their times tables on TTRockstars for a minimum of 5 minutes, 3 times a week. Your child will be given their login details in September.

Pencil cases

Children **must have** a school pencil case. These are provided through the school. The contents will be replenished, as necessary, throughout the year. Please pay for these via the Arbor app.

P.E

In the first half of the Autumn Term, PE lessons will take place on a Mondays (Gymnastics with Sapphire School of Gymnastics) and Thursdays ('Game On'). After Half Term it will change to Wednesdays (Dance with Kate) and Thursdays (Game On).


Your child needs to come to school in their PE kit on these days.
